



After the 2020 protests in Downtown Cleveland and the subsequent community recognition and pledge to actively combat racism as a public health crisis, festival organizers pledged to act and do things differently—to create a place that reflects the deep roots and rich history that makes Cleveland so unique. As our organizations found pathways to advance our work, we began to talk about how the community could coalesce around Juneteenth in 2021.

In less than 6 weeks MetroHealth, along with Karamu House, Downtown Cleveland Alliance, Ingenuity Cleveland and 70+ sponsors, supporters, and organizations quickly organized to introduce the inaugural MetroHealth Cleveland Juneteenth Freedom Fest. The group's aim is to educate, celebrate, and activate participants around the history of Black culture.

Nearly 10,000 Clevelanders showed up to celebrate and enjoy moments of education, family friendly activities, vendors, a full day of performances and the fireworks show finale. We continue to receive raving reviews from festival goers about the diversity, the energy, and our way of highlighting the richness of Black culture right here in Cleveland —despite a little bit of rain.

Freedom Fest organizers continue to work hard to represent the community we serve, provide opportunities for black owned businesses and working artists, as well as activate the community around Black history, structural racism and social determinates of health. Rain or shine—we'll see you June 18, 2022, for the second annual MetroHealth Cleveland Juneteenth Freedom Fest!


